



#### **UF/IFAS Donors by Fiscal Year**




ndowments are permanent, named funds that provide annual, renewable support for UF/IFAS programs. The donors designate the use of the endowment's earnings for a UF/IFAS area or program of their choice. A minimum gift of \$30,000 is required to establish an endowment.



Endowment assets are managed and invested by the University of Florida Foundation through the **University of Florida Investment Corporation (UFICO),** created in 2004 to manage UF's investment portfolio. As of June 30, 2025, there are more than 450 UF/IFAS endowment funds established by individual alumni, businesses, organizations, associations, and friends, with a combined value of more than \$193 million.

**OF LEADERSHIP AND IMPACT** 



hanks to the heartfelt generosity of UF/IFAS College of Agricultural and Life Sciences (CALS) alumni and friends, more than \$46,000 has been raised to establish the **R. Elaine Turner Endowment Fund in CALS** — a lasting tribute to Dr. Elaine Turner's remarkable decade of leadership as dean (2014–2024).

During her tenure, Dr. Turner championed student development and innovation, most notably through the creation of the **CALS Florida Youth Institute (FYI)** in 2016. This immersive, weeklong

program has empowered more than 200 high school juniors and seniors to explore global challenges in food security, agriculture, natural resources, and the life sciences.

Through hands-on learning and mentorship from experts, FYI participants are inspired to think





critically and envision future careers in these vital fields. The Turner Endowment will provide recruiting scholarships for FYI participants, helping them take their first steps toward becoming future CALS Gators and transformative leaders in their communities and beyond.

We are deeply grateful to everyone who contributed to this fund, ensuring that Dean Turner's legacy continues to shape the next generation of changemakers.

### JIM HANDLEY **ENDOWED PROFESSORSHIP IN** BEEF CATTLE **SCIENCES**



new professorship will honor James E."Jim" Handley, who served the Florida Cattlemen's Association (FCA) for 26 years. The Florida Cattlemen's Foundation pledged \$1 million to create the **Jim Handley Endowed** Professorship in Beef Cattle Sciences and surprised Jim with the announcement at their annual convention in June.

Jim cares deeply about Florida cattle ranchers, engaging youth in agriculture, and the University of Florida. Fittingly, the Handley Professorship will be housed in the UF/IFAS Department of Animal Sciences and will support teaching, research and Extension work that directly benefits the Florida beef cattle industry.

Jim is a UF animal sciences alumnus and has served on several boards, including the Council for Agricultural Research, Extension and Teaching; the Florida 4-H Foundation; Florida Ag Hall of Fame; and the Florida Agriculture Council.

# A TRAILBLAZING SCHOLARSHIP ## FOR FLORIDA 4-H'ERS



stablished this spring by George D.
"Sandy" Dunn in memory of his wife of
62 years, the **Diane M. Dunn Legacy Trades 4-H Scholarship Endowment** is the first 4-H scholarship in the state dedicated to further education in accredited trade, technical or vocational programs. The scholarship will primarily benefit 4-H members in St. Johns County, with opportunities extended to 4-H'ers from Putnam and Flagler Counties.

Diane was an organizing member of Extension's Community Homemakers Club in 1972 and served as president of the Volusia County Council of Extension Homemakers. She also served on the Volusia County Fair's Board of Directors for more than 20 years, including many years as Creative Arts Display Superintendent. This endowment reflects her passionate involvement in community and Extension programs, and her belief in the power of youth and the importance of supporting their growth and education.

Trade and vocational careers offer a cost-effective alternative to four-year programs, equipping students for entry into the workforce with in-demand skills and bringing skilled workers back to communities. The inaugural scholarship recipient is Rhylie Hayes of St. Johns County, who will attend Idaho Horseshoeing School this fall to pursue a career as a farrier.

Rhylie's ultimate goal is to open her own farrier business. "With the support of this scholarship, I plan to purchase the tools necessary

for a successful career in the farrier industry. I am committed to continuing the values of 4-H—head, heart, hands, and health—in both my professional and personal life. With hard work, a strong foundation from school, and support from this scholarship, I'm confident I can make my dream a reality."

4-H State Program Leader Stacey Ellison shared, "this scholarship is a powerful investment in the lives of young people and recognizes these careers as meaningful pathways to success in the workforce and life. The Diane M. Dunn Trades Scholarship is a life-changing opportunity for youth and their future families, embodying a shared commitment to helping youth prepare for their future on many pathways to becoming successful, contributing members of our communities."








