




Sources of Private Support

UF/IFAS ENDOWMENT GROWTH

Endowments are permanent, named funds that provide annual, renewable support for UF/IFAS programs. Endowment donors designate the use of endowment earnings for a UF/IFAS area or program of their choice. A minimum gift of \$30,000 is required to establish an endowment.

Endowment assets are managed and invested by the University of Florida Foundation through the University of Florida **Investment Corporation** (UFICO), created in 2004 to manage UF's investment portfolio. As of June 30, 2022, there are more than 450 UF/IFAS endowment funds established by individual alumni, businesses, organizations, associations, and friends, with a combined value of more than \$174 million.

esting pairs of ospreys have been coming to UF's Southwest Rec Center ballfields for many years. Thanks to support from the Ron McGill Conservation Endowment, the Alachua Audubon Society, UF/IFAS, and individual contributions, **a live-feed camera** now gives us a birds-eye view of the nest. This past year, we had front row seats to watch as parents Talon and Stella hatched and successfully fledged two chicks, Breezy and Windy.

The Osprey Cam is managed by Dr. Mark Hostetler, an urban wildlife ecologist in the UF/IFAS Department of Wildlife Ecology and Conservation. He was inspired by similar programs and watching ospreys carry fish to their nests during baseball games.

"Such fun to watch the parents bring fish day after day to feed their chicks," Hostetler said. "I received so many comments from viewers around the world about the osprey family and many viewers had it on their computer 24/7."







Though the camera was turned off after the nesting pair left, it may be back next February, depending on funding and whether the ospreys like the new lights that were recently installed. **You can help sustain the Osprey Cam with a gift today.**





Emergency Financial Assistance Fund


Doug Archer spent 28 years at the University of Florida. He was appointed Professor and Chair of the UF/IFAS Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition (FSHN) in 1994. He stepped down as Chair in 2001 to return to faculty, and later was selected to be UF/IFAS Associate Dean for Research in 2006. He remained in that position until 2016 when he then returned to a faculty position and continued to mentor, teach, conduct research, and publish papers for the university. He died unexpectedly in January 2022.



The **Dr. Douglas Archer Emergency Financial Assistance Fund** was created in his memory to support FSHN students with emergency funding needs.

"Dr. Archer loved interacting with the FSHN graduate students," Dr. Sue Percival, FSHN chair, said. "They visited with him in his office frequently. It is exactly like him to give them money to help them over a financial hump."

URBAN ENTOMOLOCY Excellence Fund



he Urban Entomology

Excellence Fund, established through a seed gift by George and Jean Pickhardt from Venice, FL, supports the urban pest management program at the UF/IFAS Department of Entomology and Nematology.

Urban entomology traditionally deals with the study of insect pests that infest human-made structures. These pests, such as ants, bed bugs, cockroaches, and termites, can breed in or around the indoor environment and lead to infestations. With increased urbanization, the presence of insect pests in these environments can have a significant impact on the

social, medical, economic, and aesthetic well-being of people living there.

Florida's urban pest management industry is the largest in the country with an estimated revenue of \$1.5 to \$2 billion per year. Over the past 45 years, the state's industry leaders and UF/IFAS have built a strong urban pest management program together. UF/IFAS currently has more than a dozen faculty, including the equivalent of four full-time Extension specialists, serving the pest management industry in different locations throughout the state.

There have been tremendous advances in the field of pest management, to the point where we can envision a future of pestfree environments.
